

"If I cleaned the church every day, mowed the yard, and kept everything neat and tidy, would I then get into heaven?"


Agan, the answer was "NO!"

"Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 18:3










