

Have you ever heard folks' making excuses for themselves by proclaiming what they don't have? "I'm too old." "I'm too young." "I'm not educated." "I'm too busy." "I'm not good enough." "I could never do that."

When God asked Moses to tell Pharaoh to let the children of Israel go, Moses came up with a lot of excuses for why he couldn't do what God wanted him to do. But after listening to Moses' complaints, God said to him, "What is that in your hand?" God was saying to Moses, "I'm not interested in what you don't have – I'm only interested in what you do have. Stretch out your hand, Moses, and I will be with you."

Smaller churches like ours have this tendency to always focus on what we don't have – and we forget to look at what we already have in our hands. God has blessed us with lots of skills and lots of spiritual gifts and lots of talents and lots of resources to use to serve God in some pretty amazing ways. 2018 is the year we will stop focusing on what we don't have – and to start using what God has already given us.



There's an old Swedish story about a country doctor who came to a farmhouse one night to help deliver a baby. As the mom labored in the kitchen table, her husband assisted the doctor by holding up a gas lamp to illuminate the make-shift delivery room. After a time of labor, the mom gave birth to a fine baby boy. Then, to the surprise of both parents, the doctor announced that a second child was on the way. And indeed the mother delivered a lovely daughter.

Her husband was already shaken by this unexpected turn of events, so you can imagine his surprise when he heard the doctor say, "Hang on. I think there's a third. I think we have triplets!" At that, the father began to back out of the room. "Hold it!" called the doctor. "Come back here with that lamp!" "Oh, no," said the father. "They're attracted to the light!"

As we enter a new year – as we prepare for the coming of the three magi – and as we seek God's vision for our church in 2018 – it is Christ's light that attracts us to the mystery and majesty that we find in God's presence within our community of faith. Let God's light shine in and through all of us this new year!




