Our rehearsals are Wednesday evening from 7 to 8:30. Why don't you give it a try?




"After discussion relative to decoration of the church for Sunday services, on motion of A. Baker it was voted that the Ladies Missionary Society be

- 2. Cut a small heart from the middle of one big heart.
- 3. With the small cookie cutter, make several heart shapes out of the meat and cheese. Place between the bread slices.
- 4. If you're using peanut butter and jelly, spread both onto the large, solid heart. Then place the slice with the small heart cutout on top.

Most of us have had to sign some kind of contract or other legal document at some time in our lives. Every time we borrow money, rent an apartment, or buy a car, we're asked to sign on the dotted line. Contracts are designed to protect ourselves from fraud and liability, and to make sure that the other folks keep their end of the bargain. In other words, we sign contracts because we're not sure we can fully trust each other.

But that's not the case in our relationship with God. God has given everything – including God's Son, Jesus Christ - to be with us and God not only keeps his promises but ours as well in what we call a "covenant."

What does it mean to have a "covenant" agreement with God? What promises has God has given us – and what promises have we made in return? Those are the questions we will try to answer in Rev. Hare's Lenten six-week sermon series entitled, "Covenant," which will begin on Sunday, February 18th. We will explore the depth and height of God's grace from that rainbow in the sky to Jesus on the cross, and discover once again just how much God loves us.
