As we explore who we are as a congregation, we are seeking God's blessing and leadership in all that we do. To that end, a "New Life Pray-ers" group has been formed to meet and pray on a regular basis to seek God's participation and blessing in our journey together.

This group meets in the Seekers' Classroom across from the church office every Tuesday at noon for a time of fellowship (it's a brown bag luncheon moment) and to pray for our church. Everyone who believes in the power of prayer is welcome to be a part of this ministry.



This year we are celebrating the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation Movement from which our Presbyterian heritage got its start. In order to honor that anniversary, Rev. Hare has been preaching throughout the summer on what's called "the Basic Tenets" of the Reformation.

On Sunday, June 11<sup>th</sup>, Rev. Hare's sermon focused on the tenet called "Sola Gratia" which is Latin for "Grace Alone." We believe that we are saved by God's grace alone and not by any of our good works. On July 2<sup>nd</sup>, Rev. Hare will preach on the second tenet, "Sola Fide," which means "Faith Alone." Then, on July 30<sup>th</sup>, the series will continue with a sermon entitled, "Solus Christus," which means "Christ Alone."

Come discover once again what we, as Presbyterians, believe and how these beliefs impact who we are and what we do!

### Sponsoring Students from the Presbyterian Children's Home

Going off to a college can be an exciting as well as an emotional and scary time for a young eighteen-year-old. Receiving support from their family makes that experience a little less lonely and scary. But, when you are a young person leaving the Presbyterian Children's Home and going off to college you don't have the support of a family. You are on your own and it can be overwhelming. To try and ease that transition, the Presbyterian Children's Home reached out to the Outreach Committee and asked if we would be willing to sponsor five of the young people from the Home while they are in college. As we are no longer providing food or support for the college students at NCTC, the Outreach Committee has voted to sponsor the students.

Three times a year we will be putting together care packages for the students. The first one will be at the beginning of August as they prepare to head off to college for the start of the semester. If anyone would be interested in contributing to the care packages the following items are some of the things that we will be looking for: 1) snacks: popcorn, peanuts, gum, beef/turkey jerky sticks, hard candies like life savers, mints, peppermints, etc. 2) school supplies: highlighters, colored pens, post-it notes, fine-point markers, fun stickers, notebooks 3)hygiene: q-tips, first aid kit, tube of antibiotic cream, band-aids 4) other items like small hand lotion/sanitizer, chap stick, air fresheners, forever postage stamps, vitamin C, prayer cards, inspirational notes, etc. We will have a bin in the hall next to the red wagon where donations can be placed. Thank you and please pray for these students as they embark on the next chapter in their lives.







Name and describe a member that has left a lasting impression on you. What is it about this person that makes them stand out in your mind.


What cherished traditions have been passed down from generation to generation which need to be preserved?
